### PLAYGROUND DESCRIPTION

All of the North Penn Elementary Schools have playgrounds that include various types and ages of equipment, hard surface play areas and soft surface play areas. The existing playground equipment has been funded by either original building construction funds, renovation funds, capital funds, or funds raised by Home & School organizations. Through the years there has been a slight disproportionate installation of equipment building by building. This disproportionality is a concern and the District wants to plan to have the appropriate playground opportunities for all students District wide. In addition, the District would like to plan to have more diverse playground opportunities for special needs students and students of all abilities.

The assessment must utilize all Federal, State and Local agency guidelines, laws, recommendations, or ordinances as it relates to playgrounds, playground equipment, accessibility, and safety.

See Attachment A for images of the building sites and equipment.

### **SCOPE OF SERVICES**

The playground assessment must include the following:

### 1.0 Site Inspection and Playground Meetings

The inspections must include:

- a. Inspection of the existing hard and soft surface playgrounds
- b. Inspection of all existing playground equipment in both hard and soft surfaces
- c. Inspection of surrounding areas around the playgrounds
- d. Meet with the Facilities Department to assess historical playground information
- e. Meet with Administration to assess global playground needs
- f. Meet with each Principal to assess playground usage, concerns, and future desires

### 2.0 Playground Surface Assessment

The surface assessment must include:

- a. Outlining key parameters of different potential surfaces
- b. Advantages and disadvantages of each type of surface
- c. Estimated cost to install the surface in a new installation and retrofit situation
- d. Provide required maintenance and expected lifecycle of the surface

### 3.0 Playground Equipment Matrix

The assessment must include a matrix outlining the types of playground opportunities that are available per building. The matrix must include a comparison rating of the different types of equipment and playground opportunities. See Attachment B for examples. The intent of the Playground Equipment Matrix is:

- a. The Playground Equipment Matrix will indicate the number and types of play opportunities and equipment that are existing at each school on the hard and soft playground surfaces
- b. A Playground Equipment Matrix must be provided for primary aged (2 to 5 years of age) equipment and secondary aged (5 to 12 years of age) equipment
- c. The Playground Equipment Matrix is to provide a rating system that compares the existing equipment per building in an effort to show any disproportionality of equipment school by school
- d. The Playground Equipment Matrix must take into consideration the enrollment of the school in comparison of the playground opportunity

### 4.0 Playground Safety

The playground assessment must include recommendations to improve safety, including:

- a. Evaluation of all playground equipment in both hard and soft surface areas
- b. Evaluation of the hard and soft surfacing and surrounding lawn areas
- c. Evaluation of playground perimeters

### 5.0 ADA, Accessibility, and Inclusivity

The playground assessment must include recommendations for accessibility and inclusivity including:

- a. Evaluate the access routes to the play areas for ADA compliance
- b. Evaluation of all playground's ADA requirements in accordance with Federal and State requirements
- c. Evaluation and recommendations to improve accessibility and inclusivity of the playgrounds
- d. Provide equipment recommendations to provide more diverse playground opportunities for all students

### 6.0 Priority and Estimated Cost Matrix

Provide a 10 year capital plan matrix that would be a dynamic document outlining a menu of prioritized improvements with estimated costs:

a. The North Penn School District utilizes a current capital priority matrix which includes a 5 point rating system with 5 categories including:

### Compliance with Policy/Law

The contractor shall comply with all policies, procedures, and regulations of the District as established and amended from time to time as well as all applicable state and federal laws and regulations, including but not limited to the provisions of the Pennsylvania Right to Know Law, 65 P.S. 67.101 et seq., regarding possession of public records by agency contractors. 




